

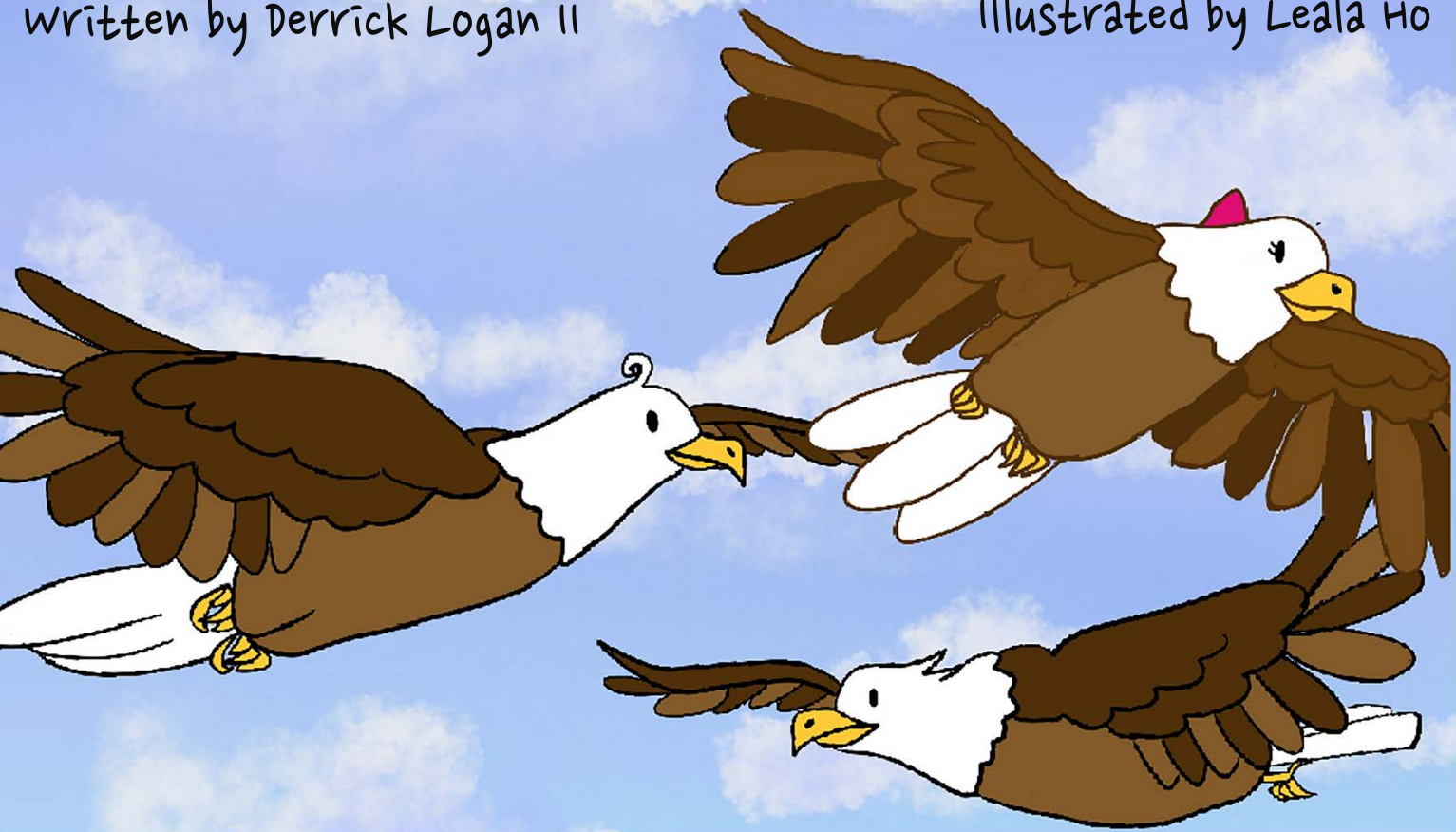

Veronica, Teo, and Marcos.

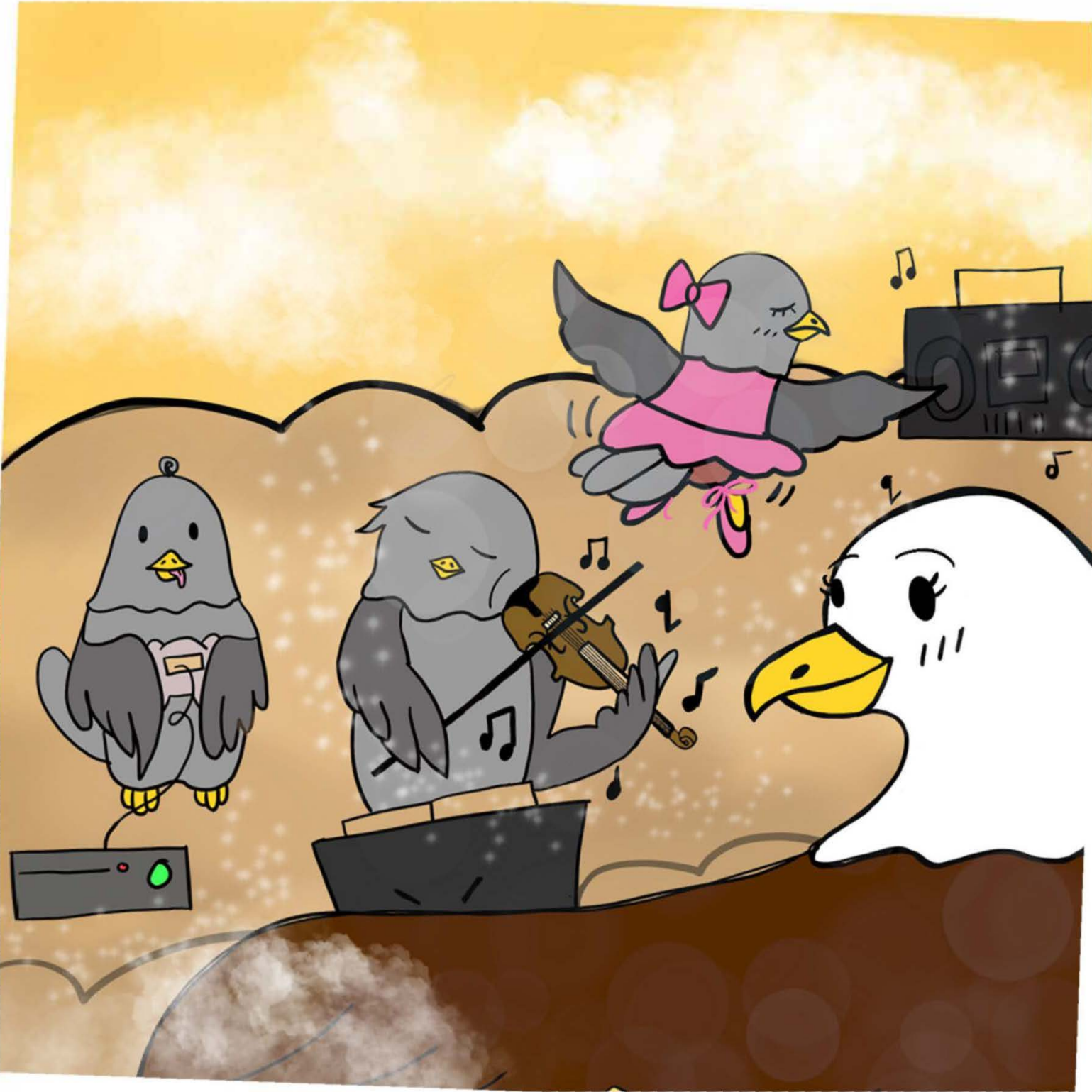

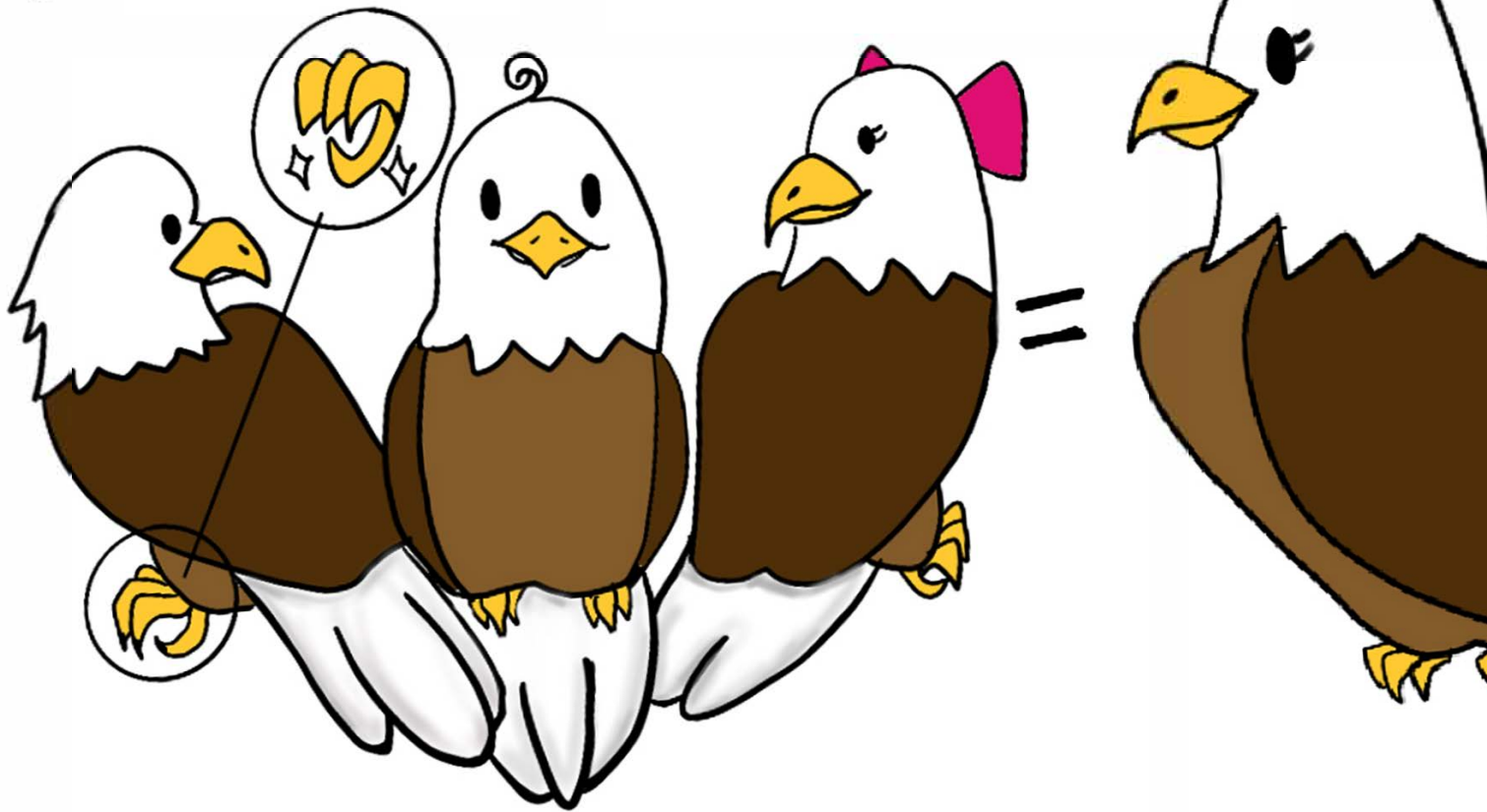
The three eagles loved to play together in the nest. They played video games, played instruments, and danced with their mom.

strength.



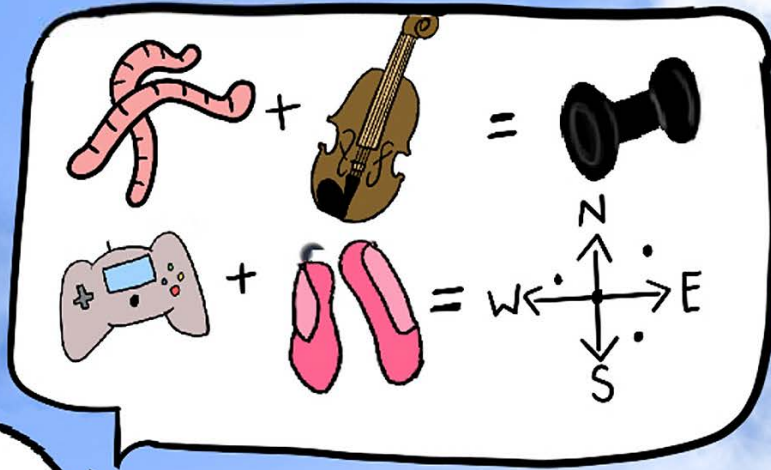

When it came time, the mom flew up into the sky with Veronica and Marco. When they felt like they were falling, they flapped their wings and flew.



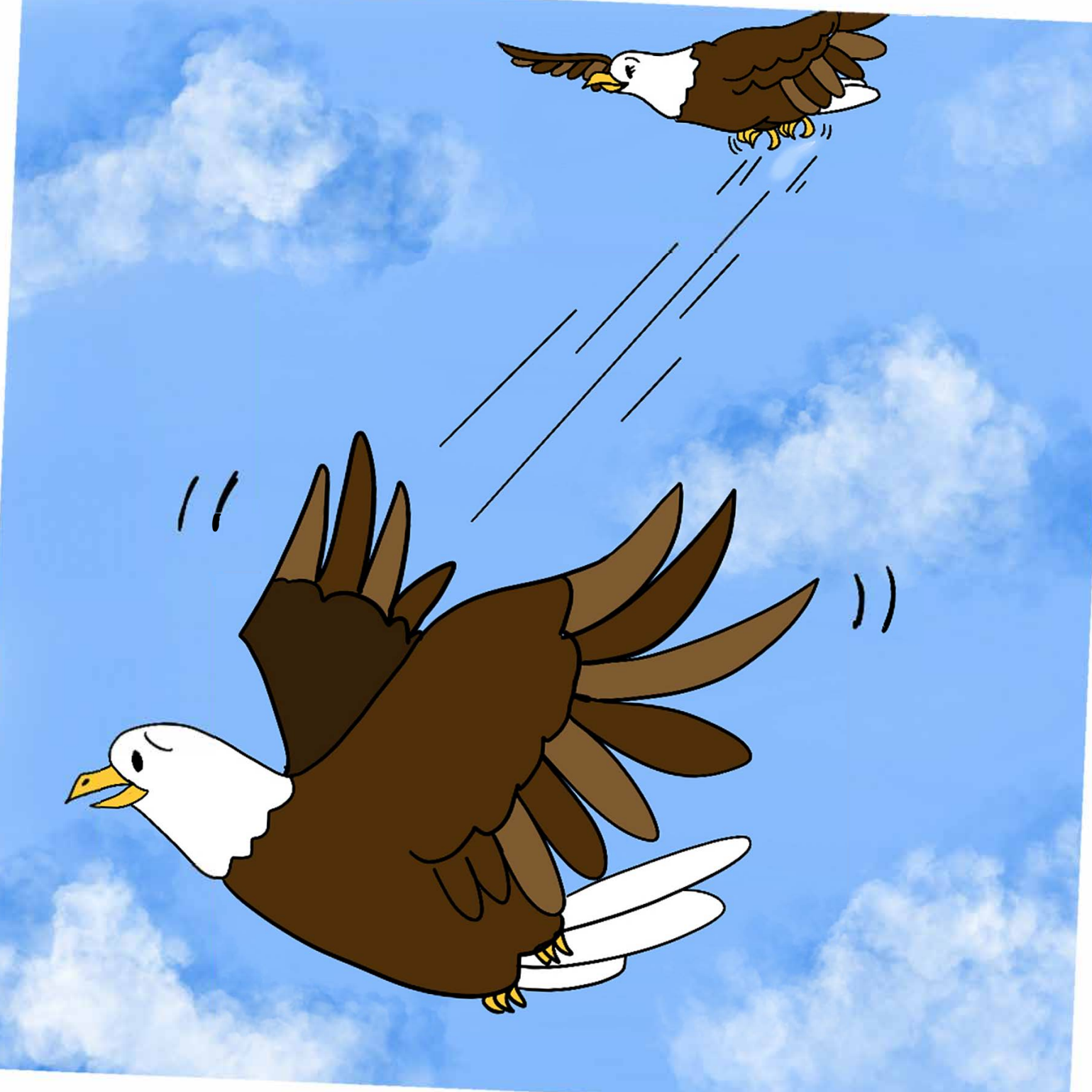
Teo was scared, but he believed in himself.



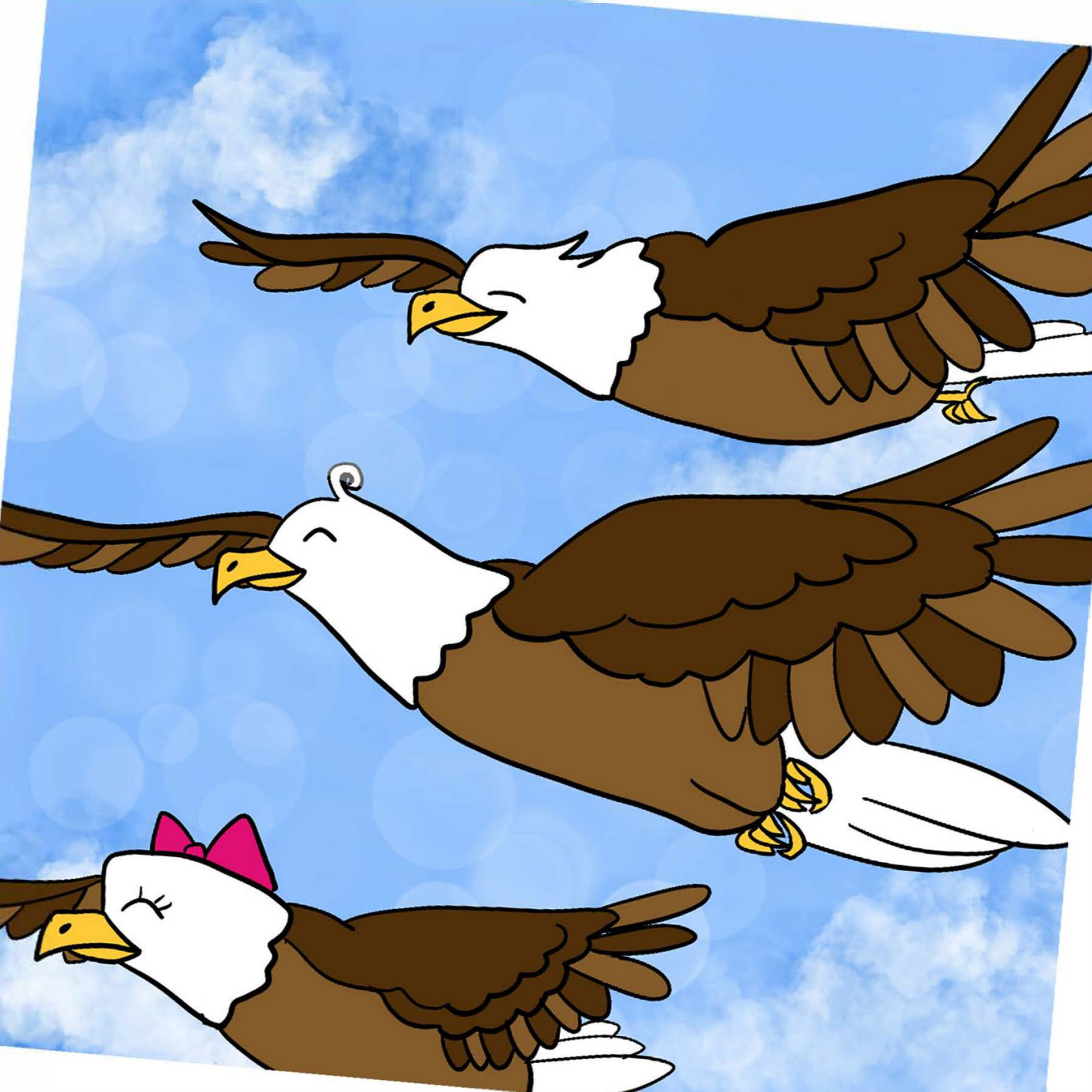
